The Alzheimer's Los Angeles Memory Club

at Huntington Hospital is an educational program designed for people who have been diagnosed with early-stage dementia and their care partners. The 8-session program provides information, support and resources for coping with memory loss and its progression. Memory Club sessions are structured so that people with dementia and their care partners meet together as a large group, as well as separately in respective peer groups.

This approach allows time for the larger group to talk about issues they face together and peer groups to

share unique experiences with one another. The program includes question and answer sessions and a host of guest speakers that may include a neurologist, an attorney, a researcher and a psychotherapist.
