As a member of the medical team, the residents are expected to proficiently and competently provide pharmaceutical care and assume all pharmacist responsibilities in the clinical area. The residents are expected to participate in various administrative and clinical projects as part of longitudinal Pharmacy Practice rotation. Additional responsibilities include providing in-service lectures to pharmacy, nursing, and medical staff, as well as precepting fourth-year pharmacy students.
